

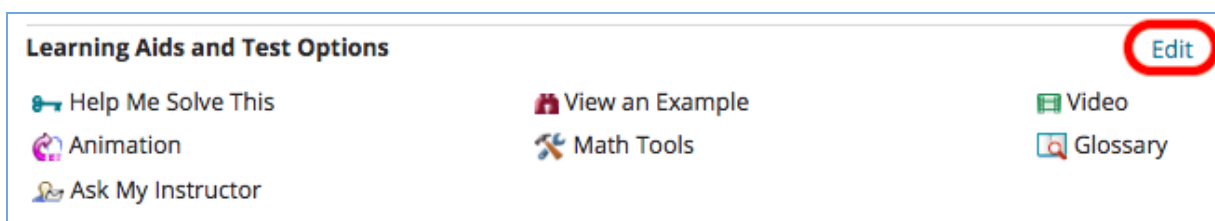
**Tip:** Teachers can choose to lock down a test or quiz which prohibits students from navigating away from the test or using any other applications on the computer until after the test is submitted.

This is helpful if you want to ensure your students are not navigating to other websites or launching other programs on the computer while taking a test or quiz in MyMathLab for School.

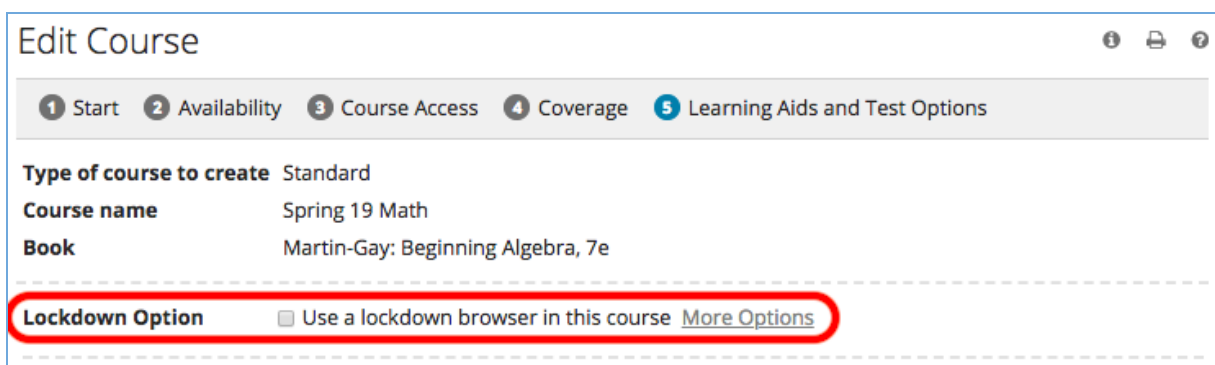
**NOTE:** The Lockdown Browser cannot be used on Chromebooks.

Follow the steps below to create a locked-down test.

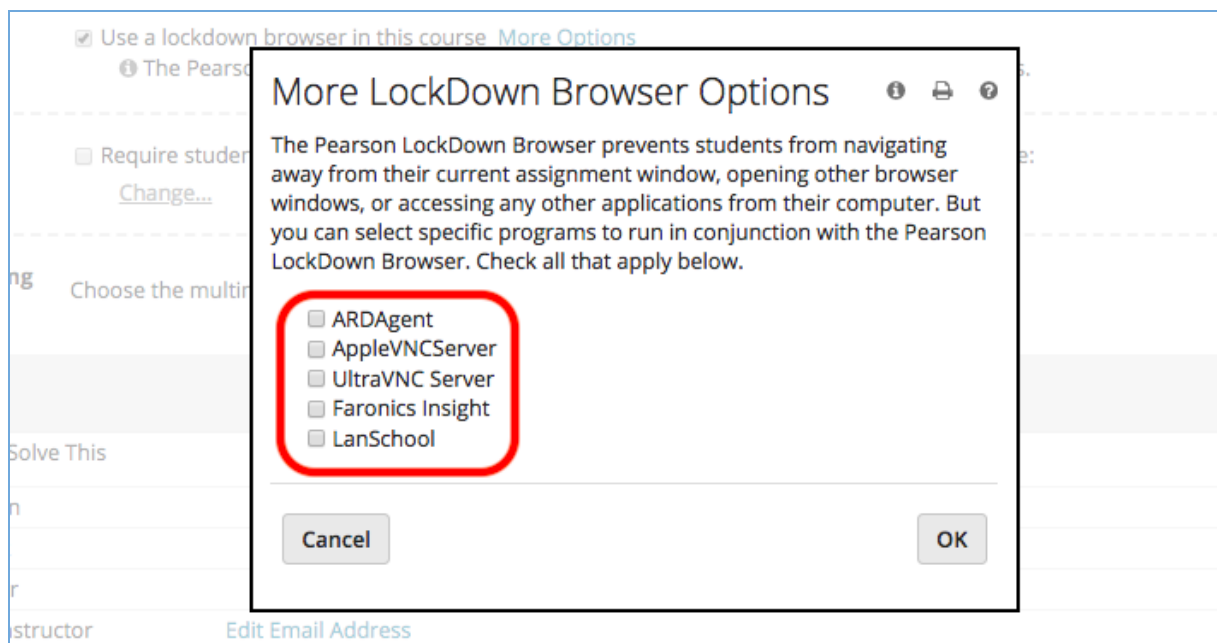
1. Sign into your course and choose “Edit MML Settings” from the course settings menu under your course name.
2. Click “Edit” next to **Learning Aids and Test Options**.



3. Check the box for **Lockdown Option**.



4. Your school may have special software installed that needs to be running in the background while the lockdown browser is in use. If this is the case at your school, you will need to make an exception for that software by clicking the **More Options** link and checking the appropriate software, if it's listed. Click **OK** to save the “whitelisted” software.



5. Click “Save” on the Learning Aids and Test Options page. By selecting this setting, you now have the option of requiring the Lockdown Browser for specific tests in your course. You have not yet changed the settings for any tests in this course.
6. To set a test to use the Pearson Lockdown Browser, when creating or editing the test, go to Step 3 (Settings) and check the box “A lockdown browser is required.” Optionally, select whether students should have access to a calculator during their test.

- When students launch a locked-down test, they will first be prompted to confirm that the Pearson Lockdown Browser software is installed on their computer. If it is not installed, they will be prompted to install the Pearson Lockdown Browser at that time. If already installed, the test will open.

**TIP:** When administering tests on school computers, we recommend that school personnel install the lockdown browser before it is needed by students. If this isn't possible, you'll need to make sure that students have the ability to install software on the computers they are using.
